Stay safe as the nights draw in

As the evenings draw in, we are offering a reminder of what you can do to keep your property secure from opportunistic thieves looking to cash in on darker nights.

Advice includes using a timer for lights so that your house doesn't seem unoccupied, setting alarms, not advertising if you will be away on social media, and always closing and locking your doors and windows – even when you are at home.

Recently, we have attended burglaries in which offenders have gained entry

through insecure front and back doors, and windows, in houses and conservatories. Burglars often use tools

such as a screwdriver to break in – and property left unsecure makes their job that much easier.

Sally Picker, Crime Reduction Tactical Advisor, said: "We want to educate Lincolnshire residents about home security, promoting best practice as well as advice on the kinds of products that help protect property and make them feel safe."

Here are our top tips:

Make sure your house looks occupied – use timer switches to light up rooms that would normally be lit if you were home.

Make sure to leave a television or radio on, and don't just light up hallways.

Ring doorbells should be approved by Secured by Design and can capture decent quality images of anyone walking towards your front door and contact you immediately.

Consider the exterior lighting at the front of your property to help natural surveillance.

Prevent open access to the rear of your property. Make sure all side gates are locked with sliding bolts, hasp stable and padlocks.

Make sure all doors and windows are locked when you are in the house, and before you go to bed.

Set intruder alarms if you have them.

Never leave keys in a "secret place", such as a plant pot, or under a door mat. If you need to hide a key, go for a good quality Secured by Design keysafe, fitted in accordance with manufacturer's instructions, and keep it somewhere not easily visible.

Don't leave your house and vehicle keys in the lock or on a side table in view of a window making it easy for a thief to fish them through your letterbox.

Don't advertise when you will be away on social media.

Consider a Faraday bag to store your car keys if you have keyless cars.

BONFIRE NIGHT SAFETY

Everyone should be able to enjoy fireworks safely, whether at an organised display or in their back garden. Here you'll find out the law around using fireworks as well as how to stay safe, and report those using fireworks in a dangerous or threatening way. Report it: Call us if there is immediate danger to you, others, or vehicles on 999.

IMPORTANT if your clothing catches on fire Remember 'STOP, DROP and ROLL'. -------------STAY SAFE------------

If children are setting off fireworks in your area, our first advice is to ask them politely to stop. It's possible they're unaware that they are breaking the law. If you know their parents, perhaps ask them to intervene. <u>See more advice on Fireworks</u>

Used irresponsibly, fireworks can cause damage to property and do significant harm to people and animals. Think of others and be safe. **Never throw fireworks, even as a joke or if it is unlit, and never put them in your pocket.**

Stand clear of fireworks. Never return to a lit firework. Light fireworks at arm's length, using a safety firework lighter or fuse wick

If you are going out to a bonfire or firework event, ensure your home looks as occupied as possible, secure your side gate to prevent open access to the rear of your property, make sure you lock doors and windows and, if you have one, set the intruder alarm.

Sparklers are not suitable for children under five. Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.

Position bonfires away from sheds, fences, and trees, and only adults should light them. Keep a bucket of water handy. Always check there are no small animals or children hiding in the bonfire structure before it is lit.

Remember to give yourself enough space for the fireworks you have bought. If you plan to use them in a private garden, check that the space you have is suitable. **saferfireworks.com. fireservice.co.uk/safety/bonfires/**
